



MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING
OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE PICO WATER DISTRICT

A Special Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Pico Water District was held in the District's Boardroom located at 4843 Church St., Pico Rivera, California, on Tuesday October 07, 2025 at 12:30 P.M., with the meeting called to order at 12:34 P.M.

The District's General Manager, Mr. Joe D. Basulto proceeded with the roll call of the attending Board members. Present from the beginning of the meeting was, Director David Angelo, Director David Gonzales, Director Pete Ramirez, President Raymond Rodriguez, and Mr. Jim Ciampa, Legal Counsel for the District. Vice President Victor Caballero was absent.

President Raymond Rodriguez led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance and Director David Angelo gave the invocation.


President Raymond Rodriguez proceeded to the next item on the Agenda, Public Comments. There were no comments.

President Raymond Rodriguez proceeded to the adoption of the Agenda. Director Pete Ramirez made the motion to adopt the Agenda as presented, and Director David Angelo seconded the motion. The General Manager announced the motion passed by roll-call vote, 4 – 0, one absent.


President Raymond Rodriguez proceeded to the next item on the Agenda, Discussion Items. Item 6A. Pico Rivera 2035: Community Revitalization Program, presentation by City of Pico Rivera's Innovation & Communications Director. Mr. Javier Hernandez discussed the city's long-term vision to enhance livability, mobility, and economic opportunity for residents through a series of coordinated infrastructure and community development projects. A key focus of the presentation was on the future of public transportation in Pico Rivera. Mr. Hernandez emphasized that modern, accessible, and sustainable transportation will play a central role in how residents move throughout the city in the coming years. The city plans to invest in public transit options that reduce reliance on personal vehicles, improve connectivity between neighborhoods, and support economic development corridors. He highlighted that the program aims to open new doors for residents by creating better access to jobs, services, education, and recreational opportunities. The revitalization efforts will also include upgrades to streetscapes, public spaces, and digital infrastructure, all aligned with the city's broader goals for innovation, environmental sustainability, and community well-being. The Board thanked Mr. Hernandez for the presentation.

President Raymond Rodriguez proceeded to the next item on the Agenda, Board Member Comments. There were none at this time.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the Board meeting adjourned at 2:02 P.M. Next Meeting to be held on October 15, 2025 at 5:30 P.M.
